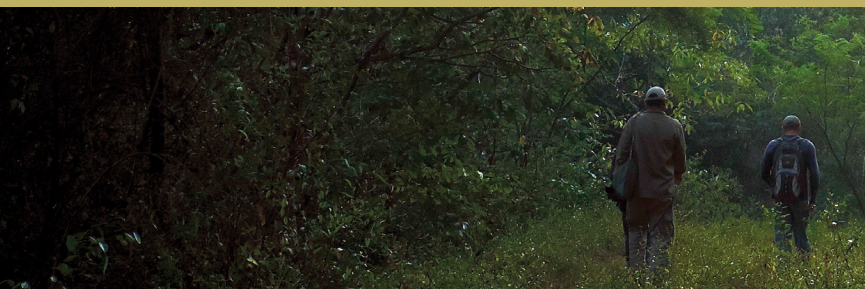

Objective

The Monte Mojino Fund aims to support local mechanisms for the payment of environmental services through concurrent funds from the National Forestry Commission in the Monte Mojino region, in the south of Sinaloa to ensure the conservation of the sub-deciduous and deciduous tropical forest.

Lines of work

- 1 Operation of a compensation mechanism for local inhabitants.
- 2 Improvement of soil retention and reduction of soil erosion.

- 3 Improvement of the condition of ecosystems and "flagship" species.
- 4 Operation of an effective monitoring program.

Achievements

Sustainable management of **2,224 hectares** of tropical dry forest.

Annual **monitoring** of soils, birds, fish and microendemic plants.

Reduction of environmental **illicit** activities.

Sustainable management of **7,880 hectares** of the agrarian core.

Data updated at the end of 2023.
