Objective

Conserva Aves Mexico is an initiative that seeks to contribute to the conservation of threatened, endemic, and/or migratory bird species, as well as their habitats, through the creation or expansion of Areas Voluntarily Designated for Conservation (ADVCs, acronym in Spanish) in priority sites, promoted by local groups interested in implementing financial sustainability strategies that allow them to conserve their territories and the biodiversity they safeguard.

- 1 Conserve priority bird sites through the creation or expansion of a ADVC.
- 2 Conserve threatened, endemic, and/or migratory bird species through the design and implementation of a Management Strategy for ADVCs.
- 3 Promote community initiatives through the design and implementation of a Financial Sustainability Plan for ADVCs.
