Objective

The Endangered Species Conservation Fund (FONCER, in Spanish) is a financial mechanism composed of endowment resources aimed at conserving endangered species and their habitats within protected areas (PAs) and their areas of influence.

These species include the peninsular pronghorn, California condor, Mexican wolf, and olive ridley and Kemp's ridley sea turtles.

Lines of work

- 1 Conservation and/or recovery of endangered species and their habitats.
- 2 Participation of local communities in management actions that contribute to species conservation

Achievements

Generating resources for future conservation initiatives that support the **protection of emblematic species** in Mexico.
